Biographical Notes

J Paul Dunne is Professor of Economics in the Faculty of Humanities, Languages and Social Sciences at the University of the West of England, Bristol. He was previously Research Professor in Economics at Middlesex University and has held posts at Birkbeck College, Warwick University, Department of Applied Economics and Magdalene College, University of Cambridge and the University of Leeds.

He is an applied economist whose main area of research is the economics of military spending. He has undertaken a wide range of research in this area including the economic effects of military spending, industrial restructuring and conversion, employment issues, investment, the economics of the arms trade. In addition to the UK, he has researched on other developed OECD countries and some developing countries, and has a particular interest in South Africa. His is chair of the UK affiliate of Economists Allied for Arms Reduction (ECAAR).

He has published in other areas of applied economics and econometrics, including transport economics; discrete choice modelling; labour economics; marxist economics;macroeconometric modelling; industrial economics; investment and stockbuilding; analysis of large data sets; macroeconomic policy analysis; and structural change;.

His publications include numerous articles in journals, including the Defence and Peace Economics, Economic Journal, Journal of Conflict Resolution, Journal of Peace Research, Cambridge Journal of Economics, Journal of Industrial Economics, European Economic Review and the Scottish Journal of Political Economy. He has also been involved in editing books including Arming the South: The Economics of Military Expenditures, Arms Production and Trade in Developing Countries. Palgrave, April 2002.
